Alton, IL Fire, May 1857

Destructive Fire at Alton, Illinois

Chicago, Saturday, April 18. A destructive conflagration occurred at Alton, Ill. On Thursday, destroying the Planning Mill of MORRISON & BEAL, the Methodist Church parsonage house, and doing great damage to the Waverley Hotel, Piazza house, and the warehouse of HOLLISTER & COFFER. Total loss was \$50,000.

Killion Jr., a prominent United Steelworkers Union leader who fought for expanded job opportunities for African-Americans.

California In Home School holds Fundraiser for the Museum

Our museum is sharing information with a K-12 home schooling group. Angela Ward, the school's administrator, has inquired about the Civil War Prison in Alton. The school wanted more information about the smallpox epidemic that killed many Confederate prisoners. She was interested in details about the disease, and how many perished. The museum provided information on the smallpox epidemic and the over 1500 that died.

Angela's next call was to tell us that her home school group was having a fundraising event to help show their gratitude to the Alton Museum.

Recently, we spoke with Angela and shared information about Elijah Lovejoy. Angela plans to have an essay contest about Lovejoy, just as we are doing for the Alton Area.

William Clark's Gravesite Bellefontaine Cemetery Saint Louis, MO

Upon completion of the Expedition, William Clark was appointed Brigadier General of Militia and Superintendent of Indian Affairs for the Louisiana Territory by President Thomas Jefferson. Clark held this post for nearly 30 years and he made St. Louis his home. Clark married twice, having five children by his first wife, and after a brief illness, died on September 1, 1838, at the age of 69 in the home of his son on Broadway near the St. Louis riverfront. Following a grand funeral procession that was over a mile long, Clark was buried with Masonic and military honors outside the city, on the farm of his nephew, Col. John O'Fallon.

Today the gravesite is incorporated within the boundaries of Bellefontaine Cemetery. The elaborate granite obelisk features a bust of the explorer and an inscription that reads: "SOLDIER, EXPLORER, STATESMAN AND PATRIOT. HIS LIFE IS WRITTEN IN THE HISTORY OF HIS COUNTRY."
